<u>Chapter 10:</u> <u>Gedatsu, a Religious Study through Daily Life</u>

We Are the Continuation of Ancestors

Gedatsu Kongo established Gedatsu as a religious study that should be learned through one's daily life. Neither harsh training nor learning abstract theology is required to master the teaching. Master Gedatsu Kongo always said, "Religion should be studied and practiced in our daily life." He strongly believed that this should be a genuine religious study for everyone.

Our Founder valued "home" as the base of our Gedatsu study, stating: "Home is not only the place where parents and children live together, it is where lives connect ancestors to descendants. Our present life connects the past to the future. We should learn from our ancestors' footsteps, develop their spirits, and pass them down to our descendants. This is why it is shameful to disgrace the family name. The home should be valued."

He further stated: "People who decry societies' degeneration in the world have biased and prejudiced visions. Who made the world, nation, society and family?

"The family is truly a small society. A family is made up of husband and wife. A group of families form a society and, in turn, a nation.

"Today's society is a group of people born to couples, who lack proper understanding. Realize that couples shaped these people, this society. I ask you to reform the family and society. People, who are only looking at the deterioration of society, are looking in the wrong direction. They should look into themselves first."

This is Master Gedatsu Kongo's fundamental view on reforming society and attaining world peace. Thus, he said, "You are the world." The degeneration of society was caused by our incorrect attitude. We should first self-reflect, then reform ourselves and our families. These are the basic steps we should take toward world peace. This is why Gedatsu as a religious study through our daily life is very important.

No one was born from nothing. Every one of us was born from parents and ancestors. We are the continuation of generations of ancestors. Our life will also continue to our descendants. We are responsible to pass on the ancestors' spiritual and physical legacy for future generations. This understanding is important for our happiness and prosperity.

Actually, very few people in modern society have this understanding. Instead of scrutinizing themselves, many blame others and criticize society. Gedatsu Kongo said that this attitude is the cause of suffering and confusion in the current world.

It may be hard for us to become aware of our selfishness. This is because we are the physical and spiritual continuation of generations of ancestors. Therefore, Gedatsu Kongo stressed the importance of self-reflection and self-understanding. Gedatsu is the path of self-reflection through our everyday life.

Home, the Base of Gedatsu Study

Home is the base of human existence. It is where our life continues from ancestors to descendants. Our existence connects ancestors' lives with future generations. We are, so to speak, the "relay runner of life" from the past to the future. We are responsible to inherit ancestors' spiritual heritage and develop it for future generations.

Gedatsu Kongo stated: "Home is where we learn basic human morality. Our character is cultivated through family life. Children learn love and sincerity through their life with parents. Therefore, home is the base to cultivate all the human virtues."

In a word, home is the palace where we live our daily life, where we raise children, and where love, morality and religious faith are cultivated within us. This is why Gedatsu Kongo stressed the importance of our everyday family life.

We experience various events through everyday life: conflicts between husband and wife or between parents and children, health or financial problems of the family members, or happy events of the family. We experience joy and sorrow through our family life. Through experiencing these various events in our daily life, our spiritual richness is cultivated, and we can grow as a person.



Husband and wife are the smallest unit of a family. A man and a woman who have different backgrounds meet together and create a family. Having children, their family life becomes enriched materially and spiritually. Many events in life happen through our family life, or relations between husband and wife, or parents and children. Through these experience in our family life, humanity is cultivated more and more deeply within us.

It may be great and valuable to cultivate our character and spirituality by learning abstract theology and practicing harsh training in deep mountains. But, as long as we are humans, nothing is more valuable than love and affection between husband and wife, and between parents and children.

This is why Master Gedatsu Kongo stressed the importance of our family life and established Gedatsu as a religious study through daily life.

Gedatsu Kongo stated: "Home is the place of refreshment and comfort, the place to recover ourselves. Home should be the shrine of peace and harmony."

"Parents love their children. Children love and respect their parents. Husband and wife love and respect each other. This is the Gedatsu life."

Gedatsu Should be Studied and Practiced in Daily Life

While Gedatsu Kongo established Gedatsu for everyone's happiness, we should remember that he earnestly desired to render service to the country. He believed that Gedatsu is the path to contribute to the country and world peace through our daily activities. And he stressed the importance of our "home" as the base to practice this path.

Gedatsu Kongo stated: "Home is the foundation stone of the country. When the family prospers, the country is strengthened."

Our world consists of many countries. Our country is responsible to contribute to the peace and prosperity of the world. Each one of us comprise this country. We were raised by parents through our family life. This is why Gedatsu Kongo urged us to build our family and country through Gedatsu.

Gedatsu Kongo stated: "Home should be the shrine to study and practice Gedatsu. Gedatsu should be practiced from morning till evening every day. Home should be the place of spiritual comfort, and the place to recover ourselves. Thus, home is the foundation of human life. Therefore, it is important to practice Gedatsu through our everyday life."

At the time when Gedatsu Kongo established Gedatsu, there were already various religions throughout Japan and the world. All religious theories and doctrines were thoroughly studied at that time. Why did Gedatsu Kongo establish Gedatsu under those circumstances?

Gedatsu Kongo felt unsatisfied with religions in his time. He keenly felt that genuine religion was not actually practiced in people's everyday life. Most people believed that religion is in churches or temples,

How to Live According to the Universal Will

Hello, everyone. I am so happy to see you again. Today, I would like to talk about how our life experiences can become the source of creating joy, hope and peace of mind in our lives.

Our universe is governed by a divine will. We may call it "Universal Will," "God's Will" or "Law of Nature." This Universal Will governs all things: humans, animals and plants, as well as all phenomena in Nature. In truth, the movement of the Universal Will exists in every corner of our God-created universe.

Great historical figures, successful individuals in modern times, and common individuals whose lives are filled with happiness – their lives conform to the Universal Will. Conversely, those who materially prosper through malicious behavior find that their success is only temporary. Ultimately, their prosperity wanes, and their names are forgotten in history.

This shows us that when we live our lives in tune with the Universal Will, the divine Law of Nature responds accordingly. The universe never ignores our sincere and earnest effort. Those who energetically and cheerfully put forth their best effort every day will be blessed with a happy future and rich-minded life.

However, if our thoughts and actions are counter to the Universal Will, we will encounter hardships, and our lives will be full of complaints and dissatisfaction.

We must always be aware of God in our lives and realize that living in accord with the Universal Will is essential to our happiness.

How, then, should we think or behave to conform to the Universal Will?

There are many ways, such as: Having a positive, agreeable and constructive attitude. Being good, kind and cooperative. Being earnest, honest, humble and unselfish. Sparing no effort and having an appreciative mind.

No doubt, there are many more answers, but "love," "goodness" and "sincerity," which are preached by world religions, are certainly the kinds of thoughts and behaviors that conform to the Universal Will and should guide our lives.

Our way of thinking and our behavior today are based on the values that we developed through our life experiences from the time we were born – from our parents, family background, society and friends. Everything we have experienced around us, consciously or unconsciously, have been planted in our subconscious minds. Our thoughts and behaviors continually draw from this subconscious source.

Our lives today are the product of all these collective circumstances, ways of thinking, values and experiences. Therefore, if we examine ourselves and find that we are truly happy, it means that we have driven on the path that was destined for true happiness.

On the other hand, if we feel unhappy and disappointed, we have been driving on the path that was destined for unhappiness. We must get out of that car and off that path immediately.

Even though we earnestly try to live our lives in a good and positive manner, things may still not work out as we hope and expect. We may become suspicious and dissatisfied or tormented by negative feelings. This is because our thoughts and behaviors are strongly influenced by the elements in our subconscious mind, which may have even greater control over our thoughts than our conscious mind.

Because our subconscious mind consists of hereditary factors from our ancestors, it is difficult to eliminate its influences. That is why Gedatsu practices such as *Hiho* meditation, *Goho* practice and *Amacha* blessing are so important. Through these practices, we purify our minds and thoughts, including our subconscious. This allows us to reach spiritual awakening, enabling us to live lives full of joy, hope and peace of mind.

So, let us stay focused on practicing the Gedatsu teaching and living our lives according to the divine Universal Will.



The Sanctity of Our Holy Grounds – Goreichi as Symbol of Universal Laws – Part 3


In 1979, the late Archbishop Eizan Kishida wrote a series of articles on the unique spiritual qualities of the Goreichi Holy Grounds of the Gedatsu Spiritual Center in Sacramento, California.

The first two articles (published in the February and March 2020 issues) dealt with the spiritual power of the site through the enshrinement of the Universal Life Force. The following article explains the purpose and efficacy of the guardian spirits that are enshrined on the Holy Grounds.

When you walk onto the *Goreichi* Holy Grounds, bear in mind that the Universal Life Force gives life to all beings and is the spirit of all existing things. With this feeling, you realize that all things existing in this universe have a vital link to one another. Whatever their form — humans, birds, animals, insects, plants, trees and weeds — all have their lives given from the Universal Life Force. If you have an understanding of this, you have some idea of the significance of the Holy Grounds.

This is merely a general interpretation of the phenomenon of the greatness of the Universal Life Force. The true significance of the Holy Grounds can be felt by fully realizing and appreciating its spiritual powers in action. You may wonder where such power is manifested. The embodiment of this power is in the various guardian spirits enshrined on the grounds.

Fudo Guardian



The Fudo guardian is enshrined as the principal object of reverence in the Saito Goma Fire Ceremony, which is performed during our Spring and Fall Festivals.

The Fudo guardian is a sacred symbol of power – referring not only to its strength, but an allencompassing power that is latent within the great Universal Life Force. It represents God's power of great mercy and compassion, which seeks to save all beings by overcoming obstructions. No human strength can compare with this mighty power.

During the course of one's life, disputes may arise from egotistic illusions. Grudges and jealousies may result from sexual anguish. All these are useless and wasteful uses of energy in life. Nonetheless, many people suffer from these mental struggles.

In those moments of mental turmoil, if you were to sincerely and wholeheartedly invoke the aid of the *Fudo* guardian and deeply self-reflect, you would find yourself invigorated in mind and body as if an electric current were being transmitted through you. Finally, you would be able to liberate yourself from your suffering – not only at the time of the *Saito Goma* Fire Ceremony, but at any time that you fervently prayed to the *Fudo* guardian. You can avoid sudden unforeseen negative occurrences in your daily life through the aid of the *Fudo* guardian.

Rokujizo Guardian



The Jizo guardian is enshrined and revered as a savior of the transmigration of one's soul in the six lower planes of earthly existence. The Rokujizo (meaning six Jizos) renders salvation to humankind wandering in these six lower realms of existence.

The six planes of earthly existence indicate six different categories of life's difficulties, but do not mean that human life is predetermined to follow a certain pattern.

Among earthly living beings, the most intelligent are human beings. This human intelligence creates all kinds of suffering, such as attachments, grudges, jealousies and disputes caused by greed. These sufferings create negative activity within the different planes of existence in life, which mirror the realms of existence in the spirit world. Thus, the *Rokujizo* renders guidance and salvation in both the physical and spiritual realms.

The *Rokujizo* guardian teaches that humans will find happiness only when they patiently endure whatever affliction they may experience and awaken to their own worth. For this reason, the *Rokujizo* indicates the duties of humankind according to the gestures and the objects carried by each of the six *Jizo* statue.

Under any kind of weather condition – whether hot or cold, rainy or windy – the *Rokujizo* is always exposed to the elements, without a roof over its head. This symbolizes the guardian's dedication and steadfast duty to provide aid. It symbolizes its benevolence to perform the work for the Universal Life Force.

Water Guardians



In the interior of the *Goreichi* Holy Grounds is a pond. In the middle of that pond is an island, on which the water guardian spirits – *Ryujin, Suirejin* and *Benzaiten* – are enshrined. Collectively, these represent the spirit of water that exists and works as one united body within the great Universal Life Force.



The water of both land and sea rises into the sky through the force of *Ryujin* and turns into clouds which cause rain. This rain becomes ground water that gushes forth. The *Benzaiten* is the deity that preserves the vital phenomena of water.

For this reason, at the mouth of a lake or river, where water flows out and is used as a reservoir, exists the spirit of *Benzaiten*. The names *Ryujin*, *Suirejin* and *Benzaiten* originated in India and were brought to Japan via China.

With life-giving moisture, water saturates everything for generations, giving sustenance to all forms of life on earth from trees and plants to birds, animals, fish, insects and human beings. Wherever water is found exists the *Ryujin*, *Suirejin* and *Benzaiten*. Even in America, where until now these deities were never worshipped, these spirits are very much in existence.

The various shrines and monuments on the Holy Grounds are not merely physical structures. They are sacred spiritual symbols and qualities.

Those who pay homage at the *Goreichi* Spiritual Grounds should practice as follows. Express your appreciation for being given life each day at the Universal life Force shrine. To *Fudo*, pray for the ability to awaken and free yourself from illusion. To *Batokanon*, pray for traffic safety. To *Benten-Suijin* (pond area), pledge not to spend money uselessly or to waste water. To *Rokujizo*, pledge to treat all people with equal kindness without personal preference. At the All Souls Monument, pray for harmony and dissolution of discord between friends. And do not forget to pay your respects at the Gedatsu Memorial Tower, where Founder Gedatsu Kongo's soul and the souls of your ancestors are enshrined.

Surrounded by the strong spiritual forces of the Universal Life Force, the *Goreichi* Holy Grounds are far different from an ordinary park. Wonderful feelings of peace and harmony are felt by all those who pay homage there.
